GOD IS BLESSING THE UPCI!

Greetings in Jesus name:



God is blessing the United Pentecostal Church International! In 2018 the UPCI achieved new records for total constituents, ministers, churches, and finances.

In the USA and Canada, we now have about 10,500 credentialed ministers and 4,800 churches. Around the world, we have 42,000 works in 194 nations and 35 territories, with an estimated constituency of 4.9 million.

I love this God-ordained movement and am happy that the Maine District is a part of the UPCI. God is moving in Maine! At last count we had 46 churches including daughter works and preaching points in Maine. In 2018 we baptized at least 161 in the wonderful name of Jesus. At least 260 were filled with the Holy Ghost speaking in other tongues in 2018. I am saying "at least" because I did not hear from every single pastor. On our largest single day in 2018 it was reported that we had at least 2,220 in attendance across the Maine District. To God be the glory!

We are living in the end times. The next great revival has been foretold by the Prophet Joel and the Apostle Peter: "But this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel; And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams: Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy and your young men shall see visions. (Acts 2:16-17)

It is now time to intentionally target your prodigal sons and daughters. An unprecedented number of prodigal sons and daughters are returning home. They are coming. They will play, as prophesied, a prominent and prophetic role in the last great revival before the Church is caught away. The return of the prodigals will, at least in part, fulfill the prophecy of Joel 2:25. "Years" will be restored.

We must be positioned for and make a place for the return of our prodigal sons and daughters now **before they get here**. They are on their way home right now. It is the will of God for us to pray without ceasing for their restoration and be ready to embrace them when they get home.

2019 is the year of Revival, Renewal, and Restoration. Claim this. Believe it. Let's agree. Talk often about revival, renewal, and restoration happening in 2019. Preach, teach, and talk about it in church and at home. Sing about it. Revival, renewal, and restoration needs to be our theme because this is what God is doing this year. When the prodigals get here they shall prophesy. In our Lord's parable recorded in Luke 15, the father gave the prodigal the best robe, a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. The ring was a mark of favor and a symbol of conferring office. Furthermore, servants did not usually wear shoes but the prodigal would not be treated as a servant, or even as a lesser son, but as a son with full rights and blessings as if he had never strayed—better than new and whiter than snow.

Here's an excerpt from Kristin Keller's Hyphen Leadership Resource "Many years ago, I came across a staggering article that stirred my heart in the USA TODAY newspaper. The headline on the front page of the paper grabbed my attention. It read in bold letters that leaped off the page, "Young Adults Aren't Sticking with Church". The article was written by Cathy Grossman in coordination with Lifeway Research. In the extensive study they discovered that in evangelical and mainline Christian churches, in America, seven out of ten young adults between the ages of eighteen to thirty have left the church of their youth. The dropout rate of hyphen age evangelicals is up to an astounding seventy percent. One of the primary missions of every generation of church leaders is to hand the faith and the church over to the next generation. Practically speaking, churches that fail to reach young adults will struggle far more a decade from now than churches that don't. Hyphens are eager to learn, help, and be used in their churches. There's a desire in this group of young adults to see the lost saved and to see our mission fields thrive. The amount of

AYC participants has more than tripled since 2005 and most of the attendees are Hyphens. This is proof that our Hyphen Generation is willing to do whatever it takes and no matter the cost, to reach the lost.


