CAN THESE BONES LIVE?

The text in Ezekiel 37 informs us of the experience of the prophet Ezekiel in the valley of dry bones. The backdrop of our scripture text seems to be the place of a major defeat, a place of devastation and destruction. In

fact, each of the bodies that were scattered about the bottom of the valley floor were so far gone, that they were simply bones. There was no living tissue, and with the exception of the faint memory that each had been human with a never dying soul, it seemed as if it was a hopeless pile of rubble.

Ezekiel 37:1-3 tells us: "The hand of the Lord was upon me, and carried me out in the spirit of the Lord, and set me down in the midst of the valley which was full of bones, and caused me to pass by them round about: and, behold, there were very many in the open valley; and, lo, they were very dry. And he said unto me, Son of man, can these bones live? and I answered, O Lord God, thou knowest."

The first thing I notice about this passage is not the valley, or the bones even, it's Ezekiel's response to the Lord. He did not respond as many of us would have. Instead of saying "well God, it's a pile of dry bones, I don't think they can live", he put the question right back on God by saying, "O Lord God, Thou knowest." He responded in a way that took the limits off what God could do in that valley.

There are a few more things that we should take note of in Ezekiel's Boneyard Experience. Notice this:

- 1. God put Ezekiel in the valley! The beginning part of our passage says, "The hand of the lord was upon me, and cared me out in the spirit of the Lord, and set me down...". This was not a choice that Ezekiel made, to be in this valley of dry bones, instead, God CHOSE to set him down there. Does God put us in the middle of a fight to be defeated? No way! Have you ever considered that God put you where you are that you might learn of Him, witness His power, or even save your soul? Notice the Faith of Ezekiel! He said: The hand of the Lord was upon me, and carried me...", he recognized that God put him in that place to show him something miraculous! When we encounter our valley of dry bones, there is a reason that God has put us there. It's a time to have faith and recognize that God is about to perform a miracle.
- 2. These were dry bones left unburied by the enemy! These bones were left in this valley by an enemy that wanted to remind all who passed through there of a great defeat. Not only a reminder of defeat, but of failure, disappointment, and frustration. These bones were not even laying nicely in full skeleton form, they were disjointed, scattered, and severed. Satan would have us look on our valley of dry bones and see our failures, the shattered hopes and dreams of our past, and our defeat in that place. Satan fills our minds with fear that we can't get ahold of the plan of God! He wants us to remember the defeat so that we cannot remember the promises of victory and restoration. At the same time that Satan would remind you of your past, God would want you to know that He can make all things new, even when the pieces are broken and scattered.

In February of 2020, reports of an outbreak of a strange virus in a far region of China started to make its way into the news cycle. Little did we

realize that in a few very short months, it would excel into a global pandemic, affecting almost every aspect of our lives. Not only have we seen the effects of this virus, but there has also been a global uptick in political upheavals and turmoil here at home and around the world. The threat of war with China over their claims to Taiwan, or more recently seeing the turmoil and atrocities that are associated with war in the nation of Ukraine are part of what has resulted in a lack of food

production causing an increase in food shortages throughout the world. This is just a brief highlight summary of the events that are happening around us in the world currently.

in the nation of Cuba! There were also 28 recently baptized in the nation of Bangladesh! In one area of Africa, nine students recently graduated from Bible School while 136 others received the Holy Ghost in just two days!

These few examples of what God is doing all around the world should create great excitement in us! While the media is concerned about the possibility of a third world war, God is opening doors for revival! Even during war, God is still moving in Russia itself!

The church in Moscow has reported baptisms and the outpouring of the Holy Ghost! 
GOOD GRIEF, WHAT WILL IT TAKE?

Grief is a natural response to loss. It's the emotional suffering one feels when something or someone you love is taken away. Often, the pain of loss can feel overwhelming. You may experience all kinds of difficult and unexpected emotions, from

shock or anger to disbelief, guilt, and profound sadness.

Grief is not something that anyone asks to go through; yet, there will come a time in every person's life when they will experience grief. Grief comes when we experience loss. People experience grief



In addition to physical grief, we can experience spiritual grief. Spiritual grief is also that 'pit in the stomach' feeling but in the spiritual sense. Unlike physical grief that happens as a result of a direct action (someone died, a marriage failed, a job ended), spiritual grief sometimes stirs in us when we see someone going down a path toward destruction with no regard for eternity. With spiritual grief, you sit by and watch. It is grieving that the people you love do not have a relationship with the God that you love. Spiritual grief, as well as physical grief, can come in different degrees, under different circumstances.

Sometimes spiritual grief occurs when we feel lost or apart from God's voice and presence. We love him, we serve him, we're faithful, we do everything we know to do, but somehow he seems distant. We read of Cornelius in Acts 10, and he was a devout man. He thought he was doing everything he should. God honored his prayers and spoke to him. He instructed him to send for Peter. When Peter got to the house of Cornelius, he shared

the gospel of Jesus, and Cornelius was filled with the Holy Ghost. Cornelius was fasting, indicating he may have been distressed or grieved in some way. God revealed the gospel to him and gave him the revelation of the Holy Ghost. When you feel distant from God, your spirit may grieve. God will honor your prayer and your seeking and he will connect with you. You may question all you have done or wonder why God is not there when you have been

faithful, but know that God is always there!

Sometimes spiritual grief occurs when individuals watch their loved ones living life on their own terms rather than in accordance to the word of God. Sometimes watching them struggle

or experience hurt and pain because of their decision to turn away from God is frustrating. We know that God could prevent hurt and pain if they would turn to him. It can grieve our spirit to know there is an answer but see them refuse it. This is when we grieve for their souls rather than their physical being.

Sometimes we grieve as we watch those who were so on fire for God and once walked with him decide to engage in the lust of the world and flesh and walk farther and farther away from God. Spiritual grief can lead us to a place of prayer where we ask, what will it take?! Then, as our spirit begins to understand the root of grief, we can begin to pray that is enough! When our grief begins to motivate us to pray in the spirit, we can then see God do a work. We can so those who have strayed return to God and see our mourning – or grief – turn to dancing.

3. There is a cure! There is a miracle waiting in your valley of dry bones if you will heed the words of the Lord and speak His life into your situation. The following verses of Ezekiel 37 outline how God spoke to Ezekiel and asked him to speak life into the dry bones. God used His word and Ezekiel's faith to speak life and blessing into those bones.

If the dry bones in Ezekiel's valley can live, that means there is hope for the dry bones in your valley today! By having faith in God and faith to speak His word over the valley, Ezekiel not only saw the restoration of the bones, but life breathed back into them and verse 10 says "...and they lived, and stood up upon their feet, an exceeding great army." Not only will God put life back into your situation, but He will make those dead things be a fighting force against what you will face in the future. Instead of a reminder from Satan of the failures and disappointments of the past, this army will be a reminder of the power and the faithfulness of God in your situation.

Just as Ezekiel prophesied to the dry bones, we too can prophesy to our situation. We can take the blessings of God and speak them into our lives. Deuteronomy 28 says in verse 2 that if we will hearken unto the voice of the Lord our God, there will be many blessings that come on us and overtake us! Blessings in our homes, on our children, on our livelihoods. God will scatter the enemy before us, and will cause us to be fruitful in all we do. The people of the earth will see that we are called by the name of the Lord, we will be blessed with plenteous goods, and God will make us the head and not the tail.

When you're in your valley of dry bones remember that God has placed you there for a reason, He is with you, and with His words and your faith you can speak to that valley and receive the blessings of God in your life and see those dry bones live.
